

September 11, 2001 · Clip Sheet

Every video clip in the presentation, with its official source, in/out points, and a content note. Footage level: **Measured** — anchor coverage, distant smoke, the second impact only as a wide shot, collapses only from far away, rescue and aftermath. Nothing close-up, no one at windows, no 911 calls or screams.

Timing: “Computed” clips were timed from network transcripts and the Internet Archive’s clock labels (accurate to about a minute).

“Estimated” clips could not be timed in advance. **Nothing here was verified by watching. Preview every clip before children see it.**

Capturing and inserting clips on a Mac

1. Open the link, scrub to the in point, and pause. For Internet Archive items, the /start/.../end/... link jumps straight to the segment.
2. Press Shift-Command-5, choose “Record Selected Portion,” frame the video, and record a few seconds before and after the segment. (QuickTime Player › File › New Screen Recording also works.) Turn on system audio in the Options menu if your macOS version requires it.
3. In Keynote, drag the .mov onto the clip’s dark frame, resize to cover it, then use Format › Movie › Edit Movie to set exact trim points. Set it to start on click.
4. YouTube alternative: Keynote’s Insert › Web Video accepts YouTube links but needs internet during the presentation and trims less precisely.
